



Welcome to the Kansas City Sculpture Park at The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art

Located on the grounds of The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, the 22-acre Sculpture Park is home to the nation's largest collection of monumental bronze sculptures by Henry Moore.

Additional sculptures are located throughout the Park, including two commissioned works—Shuttlecocks, by Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen, and One Sun / 34 Moons, by Walter De Maria.

Labels identify and provide interpretive information. For more in-depth explanation, an audioguided tour is available free in the Bloch Building lobby.


