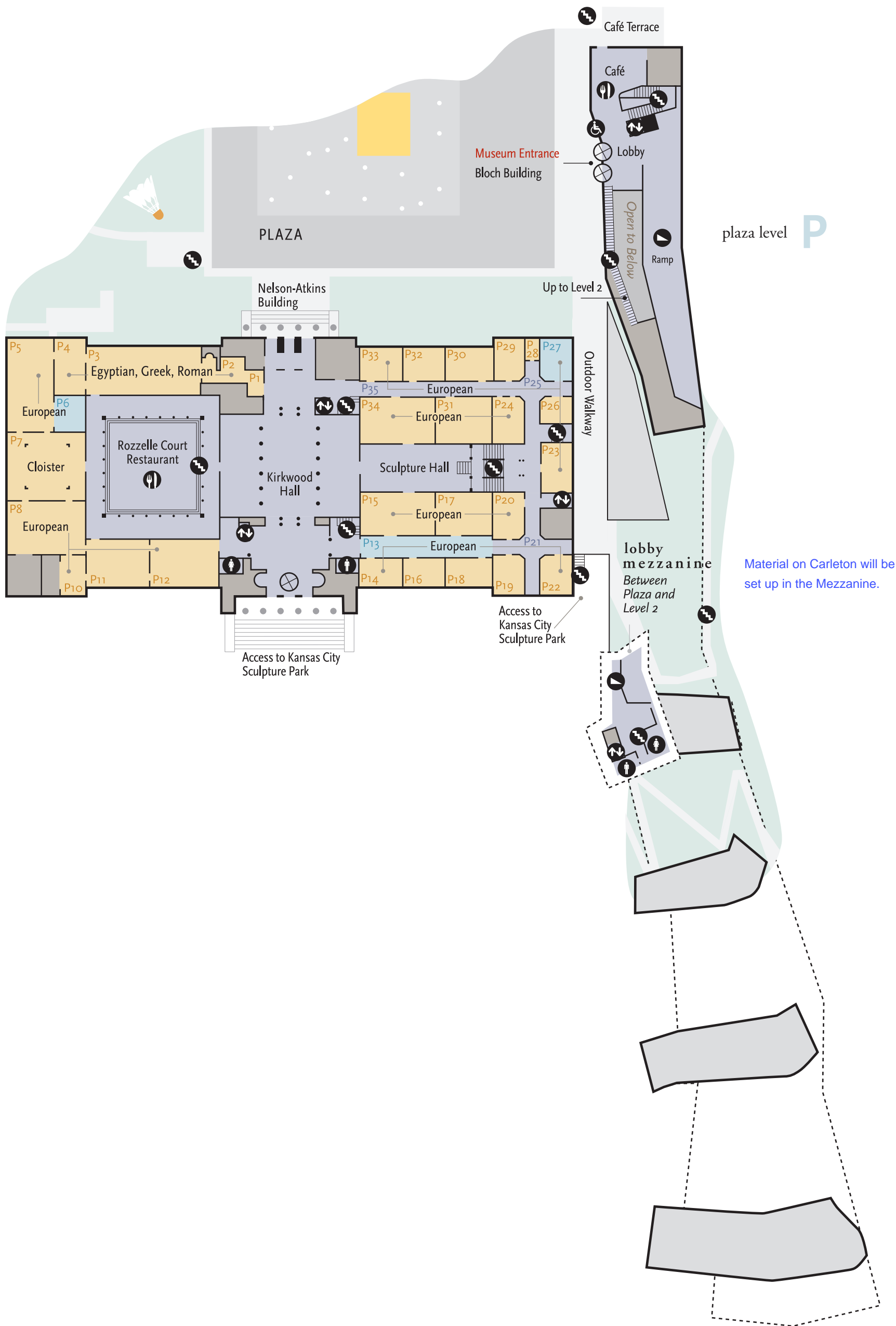

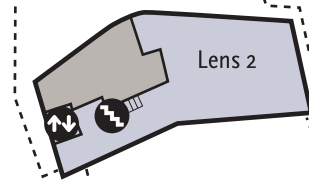

Welcome to the Kansas City Sculpture Park at The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art

Located on the grounds of The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, the 22-acre Sculpture Park is home to the nation's largest collection of monumental bronze sculptures by Henry Moore. Additional sculptures are located throughout the Park, including two commissioned works—*Shuttlecocks*, by Claes Oldenburg and Coosje van Bruggen, and *One Sun / 34 Moons*, by Walter De Maria.

Labels identify and provide interpretive information. For more in-depth explanation, an audio-guided tour is available free in the Bloch Building lobby.

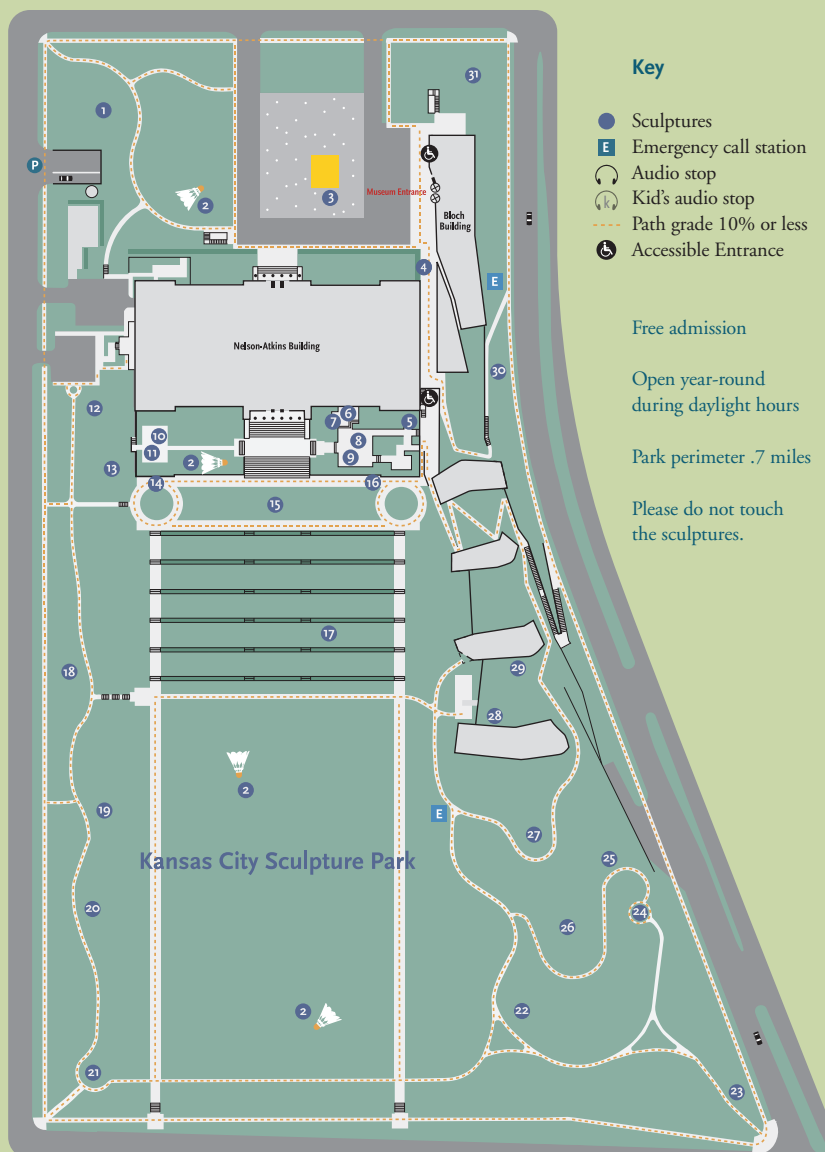
