ESCAPE TO CARLETON

Come back to Carleton for Reunion and exercise your mind, body, and sense of fun. Reunion attendees from the past several years tell us that Reunion was “an unexpected weekend of joy,” that connecting with fellow Carls and favorite faculty members was the highlight of their year. Plan to arrive on Thursday if you can, and stay through Sunday morning to enjoy the weekend fully.

GENERAL WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS

New! Night Out in Northfield

Reunion begins on Thursday, June 18. Check in as early as 3 p.m., and plan to explore the campus and downtown Northfield. This year Carleton and the Northfield community will jointly host the annual Taste of Northfield festivities from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. on and around Bridge Square. Sample local food, enjoy music and other entertainment, tour the Northfield Historical Society, see a dramatic live re-enactment of the James Gang’s 1876 bank raid at 7:30 p.m., and take advantage of special deals at stores along Division Street. A gathering spot for Carls will be available. A silent and live auction also are tentatively planned. For more information about Northfield, visit www.visitingnorthfield.com.

Reunion Alumni College

President Robert A. Oden Jr., Carleton faculty and staff members, and alumni will offer a variety of presentations and moderated discussions during Reunion weekend. Don’t miss this chance to experience the Carleton classroom again—without tests or grades.

Bone Marrow Donor Drive

Reunion attendees will be able to register to become a bone marrow donor during Reunion 2009, thanks to a program sponsored by the Class of ’84. Bone marrow transplants treat leukemia, lymphoma, and other life-threatening diseases, and for many patients a transplant may be the best and only hope of a cure. By registering, you simply agree to be put on a list of potential donors. Registration is free and involves only a cheek swab (not a blood sample).

For more information about the list, how bone marrow is used, and what it means to be put on the list of donors, see the National Marrow Donor Program at www.marrow.org. More information will be available in the final Reunion schedule.

Class Activities

Reunion committees are planning class activities that range from topical discussions and wine tastings to Rotblatt and Ultimate Frisbee challenges. Exhibitors are asked to bring their work to the Carleton Art Gallery in the Music and Drama Center on Thursday, June 18, from 4 to 6 p.m., or on Friday, June 19, before 5 p.m. Art Gallery staff members will be on hand to help display the works, monitor the exhibit on Saturday, and help exhibitors take down their displays Sunday morning (all displays must be taken down by 12:30 p.m.). If you are considering participating, please call the alumni affairs office at 800-729-2586 before May 1.

Note: The Class of ’59 also will have a separate “Creative Endeavors” show.

Don’t Miss Your Workout/Reunion Spa

Carleton’s Recreation Center, located near Goodhue, will be available for your use during Reunion. The center features an indoor track, three racquetball courts, 100 exercise machines, and climbing and bouldering walls. It will be open during the weekend for general use. Other activities may include massage therapy and yoga classes.

Relive Your DJ Days

Did you have a radio show when you were at Carleton? Want a chance to play your music once again? The KRLX radio

station will be open during Reunion for any alumni who would like to participate. No experience is necessary; student experts will help you get acquainted with the station and will help if needed during the show. Check the box on the registration form if you'd like to sign up.

Reunion—Going Green

Carleton strives to be a model of stewardship for the environment by incorporating ideals of sustainability into the operations of the College. Alumni office staff members have worked to reduce drastically the amount of paper used before and during the weekend: folders that in the past have included multiple pages of general information for attendees have been discontinued. Instead, posters, bulletin boards, and other means will be used to communicate important information during the weekend.

In addition, the alumni office staff and Carleton Dining Services are working together to reduce the amount of paper and plastic waste generated during meals. Compostable plates, utensils, cups, and packaging will be used for all outdoor meals during Reunion. The weekend program also will feature visits to Carleton's wind turbine and other information about Carleton's sustainability initiatives.

THURSDAY

Nearly half of attendees now arrive on Thursday of Reunion weekend. Arrive early to participate fully in the weekend's activities. Take the opportunity to get reacquainted with the campus and Northfield before activities get into full swing on Friday morning. Registration and residence halls open at 3 p.m. on Thursday, June 18. Tee Off with Friends

Sign up for the Carleton Open at the beautiful Northfield Golf Club and play with classmates and other alumni Thursday afternoon, June 18. The tournament uses a team scramble format with flights for men, women, and couples. Teams will be organized with player participation and handicapped using the "Thurnblad System," which has proven immensely equitable over the past 12 years.

Check-in will start at 11:30 a.m. for a shotgun start at 1:00 p.m. An optional sandwich buffet lunch will be available for purchase. The single fee of \$65 includes golf, a cart, and prizes. To reserve your place, fill out the golf section of the reunion registration form.

Participants are responsible for their own transportation and golf equipment. The Northfield Golf Club has some clubs for rent, but suggests reserving them early by phoning the Pro Shop at 507-645-4026, ext. 1.

After the alumni office receives your Reunion registration, you will receive a registration form from the golf committee that will allow you to provide your handicap information and input on forming a team. The committee encourages you to register before May 1. Registrations will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis until the field reaches capacity or until June 2. You will be notified if you are placed on a waiting list.

Parade of Classes

The Parade of Classes is a Reunion tradition and highlight. Alumni and family members are both spectators and participants, and the parade is a visual reminder of Carleton's history. On Saturday at 9:45 a.m., alumni, guests, and families line up in order of class year around the Bald Spot with the senior classes near Sayles-Hill and the younger classes stretching toward the Chapel. The parade begins as the most senior alumni parade past the younger classes on their way to the Alumni Convocation in the Chapel. The next youngest class then falls in behind.

Alumni Convocation

During the Saturday morning Alumni Convocation in Skinner Memorial Chapel, Alumni Association President Jamie Hague '91 will present the Alumni Association Distinguished Achievement and Exceptional Service awards. Children's Program—Camp Carleton

The children's program provides interesting and fun age-appropriate activities for children ages 5 to 12. For your child's safety and comfort, 5-year-olds must have completed kindergarten. Kids' meals are included in the cost of the program. Please use the special section on the registration form to register your child in advance.

Barb Howe is the director of Camp Carleton and has coordinated Carleton's Reunion weekend children's programming since 1982. She has taught kindergarten, first grade, and Title One (supplemental reading and math). She also has served as the children's arts coordinator at the Northfield Arts Guild, and she presently is the director and three-day lead teacher at Open Door Nursery School in Northfield.

Activities usually include a mix of art, music, activities and games, movies, a visit to a local nature center, and a walk in

the Arb led by student naturalists. Parents must sign an emergency medical authorization slip at registration for each child attending.

For safety reasons, **children may only join or leave the program at pre-set times.** We appreciate your cooperation. The children's program director will contact parents in the event of behavioral or medical problems.

GETTING TO CAMPUS

Save on Airfare

Carleton College has selected Northwest Airlines as the official carrier for Reunion. If you travel to Minneapolis/St. Paul between June 16 and 25, you may be eligible to receive an additional discount.

Call Northwest Airlines at 800-225-2525 or visit www.nwa.com. Identify yourself as attending the Carleton College Reunion and/or reference the Worldfile code NM2VJ when making your reservation. Your local travel agency can access the Northwest Airlines discount by calling Northwest Meeting Services at 800-328-1111 weekdays 7:30 a.m.–7:30 p.m. (CT). Refer to the Northwest Worldfile code.

Airport Shuttle Service

Chartered motorcoach shuttle service is available for \$50 round trip (\$25 one way), between the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport and Carleton on Thursday at 2:30 p.m., 5 p.m., and 8:30 p.m.; Friday, 11 a.m.; and Sunday, 8 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 1 p.m. Preregistration is required. If no one has registered in advance for a particular shuttle time, a shuttle will not be provided. Children's car seats are not available.

On arrival at the airport (Lindbergh Terminal), proceed to the lower baggage claim level and check in at the Carleton information booth near baggage claim #6 (*look for signs and the maize and blue balloons*). Carleton students will assist you. **Note:** several airlines (Southwest, Midwest, AirTran, Sun Country) now use the smaller Humphrey Terminal. Please indicate your airline when reserving a shuttle and we will contact you about special arrangements. Remember to allow one hour for travel time between Carleton and the airport. If you register for the Sunday shuttle, please reconfirm your reservation during the weekend.

Coming by Train or Bus?

EcoTrans of Northfield can provide transportation from and to the St. Paul and Red Wing Amtrak stations and the Minneapolis/St. Paul bus stations, in addition to the airport. Call 507-664-3859 to make a reservation in advance (required) or visit www.goecotrans.com for more information. One-way cost ranges from \$35 to \$55 per person, depending on the number of passengers, with 24 hours notice.

Missed Your Shuttle?

If you miss your shuttle, the airport shuttle coordinators will assign you to the next one. If you miss the last shuttle of the day, your options are limited to taking a taxi (approximately \$75 one way), contacting EcoTrans (if available), or renting a car. As you make your plans, please allow for possible delays. Because of incurred fixed costs, we are unable to refund fees for unused airport shuttle reservations.

Emergency Contact Information

In the event of an emergency or if someone needs to reach you during Reunion, call 507-222-4205 during registration hours (see schedule). After registration closes or if the main number is busy, campus security can be reached in case of an emergency at 507-222-4444.

Carleton College is committed to providing reasonable accommodations for people with disabilities. If you have special needs, please contact the alumni affairs office as far in advance as possible.

Don't Forget!

- Bring your camera, scrapbooks, Carleton memorabilia, music, and anything else that will make the weekend special. (Label anything valuable in case you leave it behind.)
- June weather can be unpredictable. We recommend you bring a light jacket, umbrella, sunscreen, and mosquito repellent.
- Carleton's athletic facilities and fields will be open throughout Reunion weekend. Bring your swimsuit/racket/softball glove/Frisbee, etc., and check your final

schedule on arrival for open times. Please note that glass is prohibited on Carleton’s athletic fields. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our fields safe for students.

- If you’re staying on campus, we recommend bringing hangers, a reading lamp, a small fan, and an alarm clock.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

Class of 1959: Please go to Watson Hall (corner of First and Maple streets, near Margaret Evans Hall) to pick up your registration materials and receive your residence hall room assignment, if applicable.

All Other Classes: Please go to Sayles-Hill to pick up your registration materials and room assignment, if applicable. Message boards and Reunion attendance lists will be available in Sayles-Hill and in each assigned class lounge.

Parking

Parking on campus is limited. Cars may be parked overnight on Northfield streets. On-campus shuttle service will be provided from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. between Watson Hall and Sayles-Hill, and for special events for the 50th and senior reunion classes.

Reunion Weekend Housing

Various housing options are available for alumni attending Reunion. For those who prefer to stay on campus, reunion classes will be housed together in residence halls whenever possible. **Register before May 1 for the best chance to be housed with classmates** (some halls will fill before May 1). Rooms are assigned as reservations are received. If your registration form and payment are received and/or postmarked by May 1, we will confirm your residence hall assignment in advance. Check-in begins Thursday, June 18, at 3:00 p.m. Residence halls will not be open before that time. Check-out is noon on Sunday, June 21.

Residence hall accommodations feature bathrooms down the hall from your room (except Davis, Severance, and Evans, which have private/semi-private baths). A linen packet, including sheets, blanket, pillow, and towels, is provided for each reserved bed. Residence halls are not air conditioned (except Davis, Nourse, Watson, and the town houses); all beds are twin sized. We encourage you to bring the following items: reading lamp, hangers, small fan, alarm

clock, and extra blankets or pillows if needed. Irons are not available. Some fans are available at registration in Sayles-Hill.

Family Housing—Important Information

If you plan to bring children with you to Reunion, please note that most rooms have two twin beds. Because families have indicated a preference for staying in one room, rather than two, the registration default is one room per family, with children sleeping either on the floor in their own sleeping bag or on a rollaway bed (limited number available). If you have questions about these arrangements, please call the alumni affairs office at 800-729-2586. In 2008 we welcomed more than 300 children to campus for the weekend!

Northfield Area Accommodations

Reunion weekend meals are prepared by Bon Appétit, Carleton's new catering service, and feature locally sourced, organic ingredients. Costs reflect actual charges. Since a limited number of meal tickets will be available for purchase during Reunion weekend, we strongly recommend that you reserve meals in advance. Vegetarian meals are always available.

Caesar salad, whole wheat penne pasta or tri-colored rotini with choice of sliced grilled chicken, bolognese sauce, marinara sauce, or roasted garlic cream sauce with fresh parmesan; sauteed asparagus, zucchini, grape tomatoes, sweet yellow bell peppers, and sun-dried tomatoes; fresh baked ciabatta rolls and herbed focaccia; vanilla bean panicotta with summer berries
