## Carleton Football Report - Week Six

This week the Carleton College (2-3, 0-3 MIAC) and the Hamline University (2-3, 0-3 MIAC) square off in a match up of two teams looking for their first conference victory of the season.

It is homecoming at Hamline, which hasn't hosted a home game in nearly a month (Sept. 15 vs. St. Olaf).

### >>LINEUP CHANGES?

The Knights could have different look when they take the field for the game. **John Hollowed** might start at quarterback in place of **Shane Henfling**, who injured his shoulder last week against St. Thomas. Hollowed has seen action in all five games this year, going 14-for-32 (43.8%) with a TD and an INT. He split time with Darren Caspers during the 2005 campaign and is 102-of-208 for 1,114 yards with 6 TDs and 10 INTs over his collegiate career.

On defense, middle linebacker **James Colbenson** has been bothered by a sprained ankle. **Lee Davis** could get the starting nod if Colbenson can't go.

### >>SERIES NOTES

The Knights hold an ever so slight edge in the all-time series, 28-27-2. Hamline ruined Carleton's homecoming a year ago, coming out on top 16-11 (SEE NOTE ON NEXT PAGE).

The first contest between Carleton and Hamline was played in October 1898, with Hamline prevailing, 6-0.

## »»LAST TIME THESE TEAMS PLAYED

### NORTHFIELD, MINN. - OCT. 14, 2006

**Matt Frank** tallied 11 catches for 139 yards, but host Carleton College had four turnovers and drove to the Hamline University 2-yard line on three occasions without scoring as the Pipers upset the Knights, 16-11.

Hamline won despite going 0-for-11 on third-down conversions.

The game was a bizarre affair, as it was tied at 2-2 for much of the first half. Hamline fumbled in their own end zone with two minutes left in the first quarter, but the Pipers' Robert Thompson sacked quarterback Darren Caspers '07 in the end zone early in the second quarter. Carleton grabbed a 9-2 lead when Caspers hit Frank on a 10-yard fade, capping a 13-play, 88-yard drive with 5:10 left in the half, but Hamline drove 79 yards in a little more than a minute before the half, capped by a Ben Dahmes 1-yard burst, to leave the score 9-9 at the break.

The Knights defense recorded a second safety when Hamline, forced to punt, snapped the ball over the punter's head and out of the end zone for a safety

## »»YOU BETTER KEEP AN EYE ON...

...Carleton linebackers **James Colbenson** (IF HE PLAYS) and **Jerad Phelps**. Colbenson leads the MIAC and is tied for 37th nationally with 11.0 tackles per game, while Phelps is tied for fourth in the conference with 9.2 tackles per contest and has two interceptions.

...Carleton WR **Chris Gardner**, who ranks second in the MIAC and 19th in the nation with 109.0 receiving yards per game.

...The punters, **Jeff Potempa** (CAR) and **Devin Swanberg** (HAM). These two teams rank eighth and ninth in the MIAC in third down conversions (Carleton 28.6%, Hamline 26.2%).

...Hamline RB **Mark Masso**, who ranks sixth in the MIAC with 82.4 yds/game.

...Hamline WR **Andrew Seymour**, who is averaging 117.2 all-purpose yards a contest, with 79.2 yards coming on receptions and the other 38.0 coming in the return game.

...Hamline's LB **Brody Anderson**, who is tied for third in the country forcing 0.6 fumbles per game and tied for 40th with 1.8 tackles for loss per game.

...Hamline DL **Zach Wilson**, who is tied for 43rd in the country with a per game average of 1.75 TFL.

## »»JACKSON JOINS 2000-YD CLUB

Senior running back **R.J. Jackson** became the seventh player in school history to surpass 2,000 yards rushing for his career (SEE CHART BELOW). By game's end Jackson moved past Kyle Swartout (2,013 rushing yards from 1997-2000) and into sixth place in school history. Jackson enters today's contest 204 yards behind Kurt DeMarais for fifth place.

## »»KNIGHTS AND PIPERS IN THE RED ZONE

The Carleton College has put points on the board during 10 of its 15 red-zone possessions (67%), including nine touchdowns (60%). The Knights defense has limited the opposition to scores on 11 of 23 drives into the red zone (47.8%), second-best in the MIAC.

Hamline has scored on only nine of 19 red-zone drives (47.4%). On defense, the Pipers have permitted the opposition to score on 81% of red-zone possessions (17 of 21).

## »»NATIONAL RANKINGS

The Carleton defense is limiting opponents to a 89.1 pass efficiency rating, 22nd among D-III teams, while the 9.0 tackles for loss averaged over the first five games ties Carleton for 34th in D-III.

The Hamline defense is averaging 9.6 tackles for loss per game, tied for 19th in D-III. That could be a big part of why the Pipers have recovered 11 fumbles this season, tied for second in the nation.

## »»LAST WEEK FOR CARLETON

It was homecoming on the campus of Carleton College, but the University of St. Thomas broke up the party as it bested the Knights, 19-7.

Senior running back **R.J. Jackson** became only the seventh player in Carleton history to rush for over 2,000 yards in his career with a seven-yard run in the opening quarter. By game's end, he had moved into sixth place in Carleton annals with 2,026 rushing yards.

Unfortunately a total of six turnovers by the Knights meant the Carleton defense spent the majority of the game on the field. Fortunately, the Tommies could only manage to turn those extra possessions into six points. It did mean, however, that St. Thomas owned a 13-minute advantage in time of possession.

The defenses for both sides turned in solid performances, forcing a combined total of 22 punts. On the field for almost 90 plays, the Knights defense held St. Thomas to 270 yards of total offense. Unfortunately, the Carleton offense managed only 191 yards.

Carleton quarterback **Shane Henfling** was 17 for 35 in the passing game, totaling 113 yards and had a 10-yard touchdown pass to **Chris Gardner**, the eighth touchdown catch of the season for Gardner, moving him into seventh place on the single-season list. He finished the day with a game-high seven receptions for 54 yards.

One week after allowing 232 yards on the ground, the Knights defense limited the Tommies to 73 yards on 47 carries, an average of 1.6 yards per rush attempt.

Strong side inebacker **Jerad Phelps** was in on 14 tackles and intercepted a pass for second consecutive week. His counterpart in the Knights' linebacking corps, **James Colbenson**, was a factor on 13 tackles.

## »»HENFLING TO GARDNER = TD MACHINE

Quarterback Shane Henfling has performed well over his first five collegiate starts. He is 74-of-132 for 1028 yards with 11 TD's through the air. His next touchdown pass will tie him with six others for the ninth-highest single-season total in the program's history (SEE CHART AT RIGHT). Henfling has also rushed for a pair of scores and is 43rd among Division III signal callers with a 141.4 efficiency rating.

Wideout Chris Gardner ranks 19th among D-III players with 109.0 receiving yards per contest. He has hauled in eight TD passes this year, the seventh-highest single-season total in Carleton history (SEE CHART AT RIGHT).

## »»NEXT WEEK: vs. AUGSBURG COLLEGE, 1 P.M.

The Knights return home next week to host Augsburg College (2-3, 0-3 MIAC).

In last year's matchup, **R.J. Jackson** scored three touchdowns and Darren Caspers '07 became the Knights' all-time completions leader as Carleton blew past Augsburg, 37-7.

Jackson scored on runs of 6, 2 and 4 yards. Caspers, meanwhile, completed 15-of-28 passing for 195 and one touchdown with no interceptions.

The Knights opened and closed the first half with a bang. **Chris Gardner** took the opening kickoff back 85 yards for a score. Caspers hit **Matt Frank** from 13 yards out for the score with three second left in the first half to give the Knights a 17-0 lead at the break.

Carleton outgained the Auggies, 349-279, in total offense. Jackson himself tallied 143 yards of total offense, rushing for 93 yards on only 18 carries and adding 50 yards receiving on five catches. Frank tallied five grabs for 80 yards.
