Newman Language Scholarship

Richard T. Newman '49 and his family have established a fund to support and encourage Carleton students to pursue internships in foreign countries that can lead to career opportunities in the field of foreign languages. This is the third year of a five year scholarship program. The primary language used in the internship must be one of the seven modern languages offered at Carleton: Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Japanese, Russian, and Spanish. The awards were given competitively and selected by a faculty committee. Upon completion of the internships, recipients will give an on-campus presentation about their experiences.
