Tuesday, April 22 – *Ethics of Development- Food as a Human Right*, presented by Dr. Florence Chenoweth, United Nations Food and Agriculture (FAO) representative to the UN and executive director of the FAO Liaison Office in New York, currently also the University of Wisconsin-Madison Distinguished International Visitor. She was the first woman appointed to serve as minister of agriculture in her native Liberia. She is currently the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization's representative to the U.N. General Assembly, Security Council and other bodies. She received a master of science degree in 1970 and a Ph.D. in land resources in 1986, both from UW–
