



CARLETON COLLEGE PARTICIPATION IN OFF-CAMPUS STUDIES

CLASS OF 2007

The 463 members of the class of 2007 defined as June graduates and 12-term seniors, provide an interesting profile of off-campus studies at Carleton:

- 66% of the class of 2007 studied off-campus.
- 306 individuals studied 404 times off-campus during their 4 years or twelve terms.
- 301 students earned off-campus study credit outside the United States.
- Students participated in 117 different off-campus programs in 47 different countries.

The attached tables, combined with the annual report "2006-07 Participation in Off-Campus Studies, Academic Year," offer a bifocal view of Carleton Off-Campus Studies. Several interesting highlights include:

- 72% of the 306 students participated in one program, while 24% participated in two, and 13% studied off-campus three times.
- Participation by program length was 56% for one term in length (10 weeks), 30% for one semester (15 weeks), 13% for less than one term (usually summer or winter break programs), and 1% for academic year-long programs (9+ months).
- 65% of the members of the Class of 2007 who studied off-campus went on Carleton off-campus seminars taught by Carleton faculty for Carleton students. 5% of those who studied off-campus participated in consortium programs (ACM, AKP, HECUA, etc.), and 30% of the class enrolled in programs sponsored by other U.S. and foreign educational institutions.
- 58% of the class members studied off-campus as juniors. 22% studied off-campus as sophomores, and 24% studied off-campus as seniors.
- 58% of the participants were women and 42% were men.
- 100% of these majors participated in off-campus studies:
