

# Carleton College - Academic Year 2012-13 Participation in Off-Campus Studies

### Between June 2012 and early June 2013:

- Carleton officially enrolled 2035 students.
- 461 students, or 23% of the student body, participated in off-campus studies 476 times for academic credit during the academic year, the December winter break, and in the summer.
- 451 students, or 22% of the student body, earned off-campus study credit outside the United States.

## Participation in domestic and international programs during the academic year 2012-13:

- Students studied off-campus on 118 different programs in 53 countries.
- 50% of the students participated in programs in Europe, 14% in Asia, 11% in Australia/Pacific Islands, 8% in South America, 6% in Africa, 5% in the Middle East, 3% each in Central America and North America. Compared with 2011-12, participation increased in Europe by 6%, Asia by 3%, the Middle East by 2%. Participation decreased in North America by 7%, Africa and South American by 2% each, Central America by 1%. There were no participation rate changes for Australia/Pacific Islands.
- 97% of students studying off-campus participated in one program and 3% participated in two programs.
- By class year, 15% of the participants were seniors, 59% were juniors, 25% were sophomores, and less than 1% were first-year students.
- 60% of the participants studied in Carleton programs, 3% in consortia programs, and 37% in programs sponsored by other U.S. institutions or foreign universities.
- Participation in programs of varying lengths ranged from 14% in programs less than one term, including Carleton winter break programs, 52% in one-term programs (10 weeks), 33% in semester-long programs, and 1% in academic year-long programs of 9 months.
- Women's and men's participation rates were 60% and 40%, respectively.

As in previous years, Carleton faculty took an active role in off-campus studies as directors for off-campus programs and winter break field trips. Seventeen faculty members directed Carleton off-campus study programs in 2012-13: Michael Hemesath, Stephen Strand, Humberto Huergo, Qiguang Zhao, Ken Abrams, Clint Cowan, Anne Ulmer, Faress Bhuiyan, Thabiti Willis, Fred Hagstrom, Tsegaye Nega, Annie Bosacker, Scott Carpenter, José Cerna Bazán, John Schott, Victoria Morse, Bill North. In addition, Scott Carpenter was a visiting faculty member at the Danish Institute for Study Abroad.

This report covers students who earned Carleton credit on off-campus academic programs. It does not report students who earned Carleton independent study credits for academic work completed off campus. A number of students were also involved in volunteer projects, work abroad, domestic and international field camps in geology, biology and archeology, and travel. The attached statistical tables, combined with the annual "Class of 2013 Participation in Off-Campus Studies" report, provide an in-depth view of off-campus studies at Carleton College.
