



# Carleton College - Academic Year 2014-15

## Participation in Off-Campus Studies

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### **Between June 2014 and early June 2015:**

- Carleton officially enrolled 2042 students.
- 409 students, or 20% of the student body, participated in off-campus studies 431 times for academic credit during the academic year, the December winter break, the spring break, and in the summer.
- 395 students earned off-campus study credit outside the United States.

### **Participation in domestic and international programs during the academic year 2014-15:**

- Students studied off-campus on 95 different programs in 46 countries.
- 47% of the students participated in programs in Europe, 19% in Asia, 12% in Australia/Pacific Islands, 10% in South America, 6% in North America, 2% each in Africa, Central America, and in the Middle East, and less than 1% in multiple locations.
- 95% of students studying off-campus participated in one program and 5% participated in two programs.
- By class year, 13% of the participants were seniors, 60% were juniors, and 27% were sophomores.
- 71% of the participants studied in Carleton programs, 2% in consortia programs, and 27% in programs sponsored by other U.S. institutions or foreign universities.
- Participation in programs of varying lengths ranged from 17% in programs less than one term, including Carleton winter break programs, 60% in one-term programs (10 weeks), 23% in semester-long programs, and less than 1% in academic year-long programs of 9 months.
- Women's and men's participation rates were 63% and 37%, respectively.

As in previous years, Carleton faculty took an active role in off-campus studies as directors for off-campus programs and winter and spring break field trips. Eighteen faculty members directed Carleton off-campus study programs in 2014-15: Ken Abrams, Jay Beck, Annie Bosacker, Faress Bhuyian, José Cerna Bazán, Cecilia Cornejo, Nathan Grawe, Fred Hagstrom, Humberto Huergo, Susan Jaret McKinstry, Victoria Morse, Tun Myint, Bill North, John Schott, Debby Walser-Kuntz, Harry Williams, Cathy Yandell, Qiguang Zhao. In addition, Cam Davidson was a visiting faculty at Luther College Italy: Earth and Environment, and Neil Lutsky was a visiting faculty at the Danish Institute for Study Abroad in Denmark and at Ashoka University in India.

This report covers students who earned Carleton credit on off-campus academic programs. It does not report students who earned Carleton independent study credits for academic work completed off campus. A number of students were also involved in volunteer projects, work abroad, domestic and international field camps in geology, biology and archeology, and independent travel. The attached statistical tables, combined with the annual "Class of 2015 Participation in Off-Campus Studies" report, provide an in-depth view of off-campus studies at Carleton College.
