

# Off-Campus Studies

*Participation Statistics: Class Year 2019*

We spent many days sitting, observing, and drawing the natural splendor of the South Pacific. At Abel Tasman National Park, we had a particularly unique experience. After an hour of hiking and pseudo-rock-climbing, we saw a series of beautiful archways, a surreal view that pulled us and our curiosity. This space felt like a transcendental transportation to a new tropical realm shaped by monumental rocks and lush flora.

# Participation: Class Year 2019

**The 459 members of the class of 2019 provide an interesting profile of Off-Campus Studies:**

- 68% of the class of 2019 studied off campus
- 314 individuals studied 396 times off-campus during their four years or 12 terms
- 309 students earned off-campus study credit outside the United States 369 times
- Students participated in 100 different off-campus programs in 53 countries and territories

**Participation highlights:**

- by program sponsor: 67% Carleton seminars, winter break, and spring break programs, 30% non-Carleton programs (3% Consortia and 27% other non-Carleton programs), and 3% Carleton Global Engagement Programs
- by world region: Europe 57%, Asia 12%, Australia/Pacific Islands 9%, North America 8%, South America 6%, Multiple locations 4%, Africa 3%, the Middle East 1%, and Central America < 1%
- by number of programs: 77% one program, 20% two programs, 3% three programs
- by class standing at time of participation, 59% juniors, 28% sophomores, 13% seniors, and <1% first-years
- by program length: 57% one term (10 weeks), 29% one semester (15 weeks), 13% less than one term (usually summer programs, winter or spring break programs), and less than 1% academic year-long programs (9+ months)
- 57% of the participants were women and 43% were men
